Mark Goodacre is Associate Professor in New Testament at the Department of Religion at Duke University. He earned his MA, M.Phil and DPhil at the University of Oxford and is the editor of the Library of New Testament Studies book series and the author of several books including *The Synoptic Problem: A Way Through the Maze* (2001), *The Case Against Q* (2002) and *Thomas and the Gospels* (2012). He is well known for The New Testament Gateway, the web directory of academic New Testament resources, and he has his own regular podcast on the New Testament, the NT Pod.

New Testament Studies: Proposals are invited for two open sessions dealing with any topic pertaining to the NT and related literature. Related literature includes texts of Second Temple Judaism. Theta Alpha Kappa: STUDENT MEMBERS OF TAK chapters in the central states region are invited to submit papers for presentation at the regional meeting. All topics relating to religious studies are acceptable. Submissions should come from the TAK advisor and include the presenter's name and contact information plus the entire paper sent electronically in PDF format. Graduate student papers are welcome as space is available, but only undergraduate papers are eligible for the award (currently \$100 given by the national office of TAK). DEADLINE for submissions to be received by section chair: DECEMBER 1, 2011 (with the exception of TAK [see above]). **All participants, even those invited to present, must submit notification to the section chair.** This notification must include the following personal information: name (as it should appear in the program), mailing address, institutional affiliation (as it should appear in the program), phone and fax number, e-mail, and role in the program (i.e., presider, respondent, panelist, presenting a paper). Regional Scholar Awards: \$150

Junior members of SBL (no more than 5 years teaching in a tenure-track position), women or under-represented minority members are encouraged to apply. The paper must be accepted by one of the section chairs for inclusion in the 2010 regional program. A letter of application, the notice of the section chair's acceptance, and an up-to-date vita must be submitted along with the full text of the paper to **Victor Matthews** (College of Humanities and Public Affairs, Missouri State University, 901 S. Regional Scholars are eligible for a **National Award** (minimum of \$500 per award, see the national website, www.sbl-site.org, for details) and possible inclusion at the national meeting. Student Presentation Awards: \$100

Candidates must be student members of SBL, and proof of membership must be submitted with the application. Candidates must have a paper proposal accepted by a Central States SBL section, and candidates are responsible for obtaining verification of acceptance. Applicants should send a letter of application, a copy of the notification that the paper was accepted, and the full text of the paper no later than **February 6, 2012** to **Victor Matthews** (see contact information above).
