
Method Matters: Essays on the Interpretation of the Hebrew Bible in Honor of David L. Petersen

these approaches work and what insights they yield. Additionally, several essays provide a broad overview of the field by reflecting on the larger intellectual currents that have generated and guided contemporary biblical scholarship.

Joel M. LeMon is Assistant Professor of Old Testament at the Candler School of Theology, Emory University. He is the author of *Yahweh's Winged Form in the Psalms: Exploring Congruent Iconography and Texts* (Academic Press, forthcoming). **Kent Harold Richards** is Professor of Old Testament and Executive Director of the Society of Biblical Literature. He is the co-author of *Interpreting Hebrew Poetry* (Augsburg Fortress) and co-editor of *Second Temple Studies 2: Temple Community in the Persian Period* (Sheffield Academic Press) and *Old Testament Interpretation: Past, Present, and Future. Essays in Honor of Gene M. Tucker* (Abingdon).
