R. Alan Culpepper is Dean Emeritus and Professor of New Testament Emeritus at James and Carolyn McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University and Research Fellow, Department of Old and New Testament University of the Free State, Bloemfontein, South Africa. His publications include *The Johannine School* (2008), *Anatomy of the Fourth Gospel* (1983), *John the Son of Zebedee: The Life of a Legend* (1994), and edited volumes, including *Communities in Dispute: Current Scholarship on the Johannine Epistles* (2014).

Paul N. Anderson is Professor of Biblical and Quaker Studies at George Fox University and Extraordinary Professor of Religion at North-West University, Potchefstroom, South Africa. He is a founding member of the John, Jesus, and History Project and has coedited five of its volumes. His authored books include *The Fourth Gospel and the Quest for Jesus* (2006, 2007), *The Riddles of the Fourth Gospel* (2011), *Following Jesus: The Heart of Faith and Practice* (2013), and *From Crisis to Christ: A Contextual Introduction to the New Testament* (2014).
