## 2019 Paul J. Achtemeier Award for New Testament Scholarship Recipient

The 2019 Paul J. Achtemeier Award for New Testament Scholarship has been awarded to Michael P. Theophilos for his paper entitled, "BA $\Sigma$ I $\Lambda$ EY $\Sigma$  BA $\Sigma$ I $\Lambda$ EQN (Rev 17.14; 19.16) in Light of the Numismatic Record."

Michael P. Theophilos (DPhil Oxford) is Senior Lecturer in Biblical Studies and Ancient Languages at Australian Catholic University. In addition to over 20 articles and book chapters, his monographs include *Jesus as New Moses in Matthew 8-9: Jewish Biographical Typology in First Century Greek Literature* (Gorgias, 2011), *The Abominatio of Desolation in Matthew 24:15* (T&T Clark, 2012), *Numismatics and Greek Lexicography* (Bloomsbury, 2019). He is currently writing a volume on the Matthean and Lukan Sondergut in the Papyrologische Kommentare zum Neuen Testament series (Vandenhoeck & Ruprecht).

The goal of the Achtemeier Award is to stimulate the finest and most penetrating work in New Testament studies and to foster the future of biblical scholarship. The award is given to a member who has completed her/his doctorate within the last ten years and includes a cash prize of \$1,000. Papers for this award are evaluated on the basis of three categories:

- Persuasive thesis that engages the New Testament and demonstrates quality of scholarship and significance in the field
- Clarity of expression and thought
- Originality and creativity

The members of the 2019 Achtemeier Award Committee are Kimberly Stratton (Carleton University), James A. Kelhoffer (Uppsala University), and Janet Elizabeth Spittler (University of Virginia).

The call for papers for the 2019 Paul J. Achtemeier Award will open by October 1, 2019.
