BIJBELSMUSEUM

The Bijbelmuseum (Biblical Museum) is housed in two historic buildings on the Herengracht canal in Amsterdam about 700 meters (~4/10 of a mile) from the main building in which sessions will be held. This remarkable setting provides a home for the unique collection of one of the oldest museums in the Netherlands. The guided tour will include archaeological discoveries, artifacts from ancient Egypt, centuries-old models, and religious objects that both tell the fascinating story of how the Bible came into existence and explain the influence it has had on Dutch society through the ages.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF ANTIQUITIES IN LEIDEN

Participants will meet at the Museum at 2:00 p.m. for a guided tour of the collections of Classical, Dutch, and Egyptian archaeology. After time to browse in the museum, you may join the guided tour of the old city of Leiden which departs from the museum entrance at 4:00. The tour will be followed by a reception at the Old University Building. Leiden is home to the oldest University in the Netherlands and to three museums. The numerous shops and inexpensive restaurants along the canals are open well into the evening. Transportation to Leiden is not included in the tour; participants must make their own travel arrangements. Leiden is only 50 km from the University and is easily accessible by train. Tickets cost 16€ per person, and trains leave from Amsterdam to Leiden every 15 to 20 minutes.
