1. Hebrew Bible
2. Ancient Israel and Ancient West Asia
3. Early Judaism
4. New Testament
5. Early Christianity

**We especially welcome proposals from graduate students, women scholars, and scholars of color.**

Your one-page abstract of your proposed paper should include the following information:

1. your name
2. your institutional affiliation, if any
3. your email address
4. your SBL membership status (i.e., regular or student)
5. the name of the program unit to which you are proposing
6. the name and date of your most recent SBL meeting presentation (for example, 2015 National Meeting)

If this will be your first paper for an SBL meeting, you must also include *either* (a) a written endorsement of your proposal from a faculty member who knows your work, *or* (b) the complete paper.

We will notify you whether your proposal has been accepted no later than **January 20, 2020**.

We will not accept more than one proposal per person for the final program.

All those selected to present at the meeting must preregister in order to be included on the program.

Online preregistration will be available from **January 20 to February 24 at 11:59 PM Eastern Time** on the NE / EC Region's page on the SBL website, at [https://www.sbl-site.org/meetings/rm\\_newengland.aspx](https://www.sbl-site.org/meetings/rm_newengland.aspx). We recommend you preregister, because there will be a late fee for on-site registration.

**March 3, 2020 at 5:00 PM Eastern Time:** email the final version of your paper to the Regional Coordinator

### Eligibility

- SBL student membership
- paper accepted to a program unit for the 2020 NE / EC Regional Meeting

### Criteria for Evaluation

- demonstrated knowledge of scholarly resources and publications related to the paper topic
- use and knowledge of the primary sources related to the topic of the paper
- clarity of written expression
- use of scholarly practices of annotation
- originality of ideas and solutions developed in the paper

## REGIONAL SCHOLAR AWARD

The NE / EC Region will give a Regional Scholar Award for the best paper delivered by a junior member of the SBL at the Regional Meeting. The Regional Executive Committee may also nominate the NE / EC Regional Scholar for a national Regional Scholar award.

**January 6, 2020 at 5:00 PM Eastern Time:** notify the Regional Coordinator of your intention to submit a paper for the award

**February 28, 2020 at 5:00 PM Eastern Time:** email your current CV, the final version of your paper (which is a written record of the oral presentation that you will give), and all handouts, slides, etc. to the Regional Coordinator
