
## **BIBLE ODYSSEY**

#### Timelines

Need visual aids to supplement your readings? Send students to our website, where they can find timelines that display key themes, people, and events related to the Bible and its reception.

### Kings of Israel and Judah

Explore the history of kings in Judah and Israel. In a discussion post, compare and contrast the reigns of one Israelite king and one Judahite king who ruled at the same time.





### Second Temple Judaism

Learn about the history of early Jews from the late sixth century BCE to the first century CE. Write a short essay that explains how a biblical book relates to events in this time period.

History of the Text of the New Testament

Track the development of the New Testament text from its earliest manuscripts to the scholarly editions of today. Draw a simple timeline that displays how the New Testament canon developed.
