- (6) Thematic Session: the Preservation of Antiquities

We especially welcome proposals from women scholars and scholars of color.

Email proposals, with “NE / EC SBL Paper Proposal” in the subject line, to the Regional Coordinator, Amelia Devin Freedman, at amelia.devin.freedman@gmail.com. Indicate the unit to which you are submitting your proposal. We will not accept more than one proposal per person for the final program.

Your proposal should be in the form of a 300-word abstract, including your name, institutional affiliation, contact information, and SBL membership status (regular or student). You must send your proposal by **January 15, 2017**. We will notify you about whether your proposal has been accepted no later than **February 15, 2017**.

NEW: If this will be your first paper for an SBL meeting, your proposal must also include either
(a) the name, institutional affiliation, contact information, and signature of a faculty member who knows your work, or
(b) the whole paper.

All those selected to present at the meeting must preregister in order to be included on the program.

Eligibility

- SBL student member
- paper accepted to one of the program units for the 2017 NE / EC Regional Meeting

Criteria for evaluation

- demonstrated knowledge of scholarly resources and publications related to the paper topic
- use and knowledge of the primary sources related to the topic of the paper
- clarity of written expression
- use of scholarly practices of annotation
- originality of ideas and solutions developed in the paper

FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

The NE / EC Region will give a Regional Scholar Award for the best paper delivered by a junior member of the SBL at the Regional Meeting. The Regional Executive Committee may also nominate the NE / EC Regional Scholar for a national SBL award and the opportunity to present his or her paper at the 2017 Annual Meeting.

January 15: notify the Regional Coordinator of your intention to submit a paper

March 15: email your current CV, the final version of your paper, and all handouts, slides, etc. to the Regional Coordinator
