JOHN H. WALTON (Ph.D. Hebrew Union College) is Professor of Old Testament at Wheaton College and Graduate School where he has taught for seventeen years. Dr. Walton has published nearly 30 books, among them commentaries, reference works, text books, scholarly monographs, and popular academic works. He was the Old Testament general editor for the *Cultural Backgrounds Study Bible* (NIV, NKJV), and is perhaps most widely known for the "Lost World" books (including *The Lost World of Genesis One, The Lost World of Adam and Eve, The Lost World of the Israelite Conquest*, and *The Lost World of the Flood*). His areas of expertise include the importance of the ancient Near East for interpreting the Old Testament as well as the dialogue between science and faith.




